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## SITE SPECIFIC SAFETY RULES

- PPE must be worn at all times including; High Visibility clothing, safety boots and hard hat. You are required to wear and safety glasses and gloves when required e.g. job specific in line with risk assessments. Failures to comply will result in your employer being notified of your exclusion from site.
- 2. The use of personal stereos, CD players, etc. are not permitted as they can cause nuisance and also cause distraction/prevent emergency warning to be made.
- 3. Persons found horse playing around will be removed from site.
- 4. You must park vehicles in designated areas / as instructed.
- 5. Urinating, Fouling and spitting on site is forbidden. Any offenders will be removed from site permanently.
- 6. Smoking on site is strictly prohibited.
- 7. Foul language will not be tolerated. Conduct oneself appropriately at all times. Those found not respecting the facilities provided will be asked to leave site.
- 8. Keep your working area tidy and clean up after you. Use skips provided and separate waste to designated waste skip e.g. plaster, wood, etc.
- 9. Eating will only be permitted in the designated canteen area and all waste food, packaging etc. must be deposited within the designated waste bins.
- 10. Do not operate any plant unless you have been trained and authorised to do so. Plant must be secured in designated areas with keys removed when not in use.
- 11. You are responsible to conduct pre-use checks of any plant and equipment used.
- 12. Do not alter or adapt any scaffold unless trained to do so and instructed by the site manager.
- 13. Read and adhere to the method statements issued to you by your employer. The site manager will ask you to sign the method statements applicable to your work.
- 14. Report any hazards, unsafe acts or near miss incidents immediately to the Site Manager.
- 15. Use portable cordless tools or 110-volt electrical equipment only.
- 16. Do not undertake or access any excavation, roof works, enter confined spaces or conduct hot works without obtaining a safe working permit from the site manager.
- 17. No operative is permitted on site if suspected as being under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- 18. Any hazards that you are aware of must be reported to the site manager.
